MEDITATION

1 Timothy 6:6-19

Most of us have worked hard to save up for something. When you were a kid, maybe you saved up for a certain toy that you had to have. As we got older, maybe you saved up to buy your first car, you know, the one that barely ran, that had oh so many endearing mechanical and cosmetic issues, but it was yours, at least for a while. As you grew up, maybe you saved up for college, books, and eventually for a house of your own. Over many years, we so easily accumulate piles and piles of things, but always seem to want more.

In large part, this is because there is a whole industry whose sole purpose is to have us want more, buy more, and get more of whatever they are selling. But this cycle of saving and buying begins to ring hollow after a while. It does this because these things, although they may give us momentary joy, do not fill our greatest needs of heart and soul. We find this fulfillment and hope only in Jesus and life with Him. And far from being two different things, money and faith, Paul brings them together, telling us that all we have, but especially our finances, are to be formed by our faith. And more than that, money is not something to be shunned, but rather used for the glory of God.

So how do we look at money? We flee from the seductive siren's call of loving money above all else. We use our money to fight for the faith, not with weapons of war, but we use our money to share the Gospel and connect others to it. This looks like new and revitalized churches, expanding schools, and new technology; these are things that help grow the Kingdom of God and are investments for the future of others.

Construction Update



Now that the new balcony stair has been framed, scaffolding has been erected on top of it to access the church attic. The existing contaminated attic insulation will be removed and replaced with new insulation and fire sprinklers will be installed in the attic to protect the Sanctuary.



The steel portions of the new raised Chancel railings have been installed. Hardwood caps will be added to the tops. The space under the raised floor will be filled with insulation to reduce walking noise.



The area at the removed coal bin has been backfilled. Because the structural capacity of the original basement wall is unknown, the engineer required that the void be backfilled with lightweight lean concrete fill, so no lateral pressure is applied to the wall.
