



COMMUNION AT ST. JOHN'S

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine, but His very body and blood. This we eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm, and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold to a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked to first speak with the pastor or an elder. For further readings in Scripture, we suggest Matthew 5:23f.; 10:32f.; 18:15-35; 26:26-29; 1 Cor. 11:17-34.

- **Children of all ages may join their parents and receive a special blessing.**



FAREWELL ALLELUIA

This day marks the end of the Epiphany season for us. On Ash Wednesday, the 1st day of the season of Lent, the Church begins the annual penitential journey to the Cross of Jesus. The season of Lent is a time of reflection, meditation, repentance, and prayer. Traditionally, Christians refrain from singing our most jubilant hymns during Lent, and also refrain from saying or singing "alleluia" (which means, "Praise the Lord.") in worship. At the end of today's service, therefore, we will bid farewell to alleluia, symbolically preparing ourselves for the more introspective days of Lent. In Christ, farewells are never forever. The alleluia will return on Easter dawn!
